IRWA — Who We Are

- **IRWA's MISSION —** Since our founding in 1968, IRWA's mission has been to provide education and technical assistance to water and wastewater operators, utility boards, clerks, elected officials, and others in Indiana.
- IRWA is a *member supported, not-for-profit 501(c)(3) organization*. We do not receive tax monies or funding from any national organization. Our focus is solely to serve Indiana's water and wastewater industry.
- IRWA provides *numerous educational opportunities* throughout the year. The content of IRWA's conferences and workshops are approved by IDEM in order to award our attending operators contact hours.
- Two State Conferences per year (April and December) with sessions for water and wastewater operators, clerks, utility boards, and elected officials. We also co-host an Operator Boot Camp, which is a full day of hands-on and outdoor demonstrations.
- Regional workshops throughout the year held at various locations around the State.
- IRWA hosted events awarded Indiana's water and wastewater operators over 8,300 *contact hours* last year.
- "*IRWA Utility Manual For Board Members and Other Decision Makers*" promotes a better understanding between Utility Boards and operators regarding rules, regulations, responsibilities, operations, etc.
- IRWA's relationships and partnerships with others allows us to be the *voice for small systems* with regulators and legislators.
- IRWA's *involvement with Indiana Section AWWA* links us to the larger industry picture — both statewide and nationwide.
- IRWA has *vast member resources* to call upon to help communities address any given situation: experienced, certified water / wastewater operators; utility management professionals; backflow specialists; engineers; grant administrators; manufacturers; distributors; equipment companies; well drillers; chemical distributors; testing laboratories; lawyers; water tank specialists; accountants; construction contractors; contract services companies; leak detection analysts; hydrogeologists; and various other water related experts.

IDEM/AWWA – Contracts and Participation

IRWA works with IDEM on many levels:

- **Regular communication and educational opportunities.**
- **IRWA, AWWA, and Horsley-Witten teamed and were awarded a contract from IDEM to conduct Security Tabletop Exercises in each of Indiana’s Homeland Security Districts in 2009.**
- **IRWA and AWWA teamed and were awarded a contract from IDEM to provide training to facility specific operators (FSO) in Indiana. Our responsibilities are to develop training materials and conduct 24 workshops within the year.**

- **IRWA/AWWA also completed the following services for IDEM:**
 - ⇒ **Indiana Water Operator Training** – This national award winning 4-year program provided training (144 workshops) and reference materials for Indiana’s grandparented water operators.
 - ⇒ **Drinking Water Guidance Manual and Workshops** – This national award-winning Manual was geared toward Small and Medium Community and Nontransient Noncommunity Water Systems serving 10,000 or less. We also conducted 12 workshops to present the Manual.
 - ⇒ **Toll Free Drinking Water Help Line**
 - ⇒ **24 Transient Noncommunity Water System Workshops**

- **IRWA has participated in many IDEM work groups: i.e. Contamination Remediation Guidance, Ground Water Rules, Operational Rules, New Well Construction, Operator Certification, etc.**
